Once an individual has met all the requirements of a state-approved teacher preparation program and becomes a program completer, the individual is no longer classified as enrolled.

During their program, our teacher education candidates take an Introduction to Educational Technology course. This course provides instruction in the selection, organization, and integration of technology-based instructional materials into instructional settings and offers laboratory practice for the production of computer-based materials. Also in their professional education courses, students are required to create lesson plans that contain student-centered technology use. Additionally, teacher education candidates create an electronic showcase portfolio, which contain edited video snippets of their teaching and MP3 recordings read aloud and other multimedia projects. There is the expectation of all faculty that technology will be infused throughout the entire teacher preparation program.

The ULM undergraduate programs include modules in all pedagogy and methodology coursework that includes strategies and interventions for students with special needs, including students for whom English is a second language. The course that focuses exclusively on special needs is SPED 2002 (Survey of Education of Children with Special Needs) familiarizes students with characteristics of disabilities and accommodation strategies. Students learn about RTI and the referral/IEP process and the role(s) they will play in the process. At the same time students take SPED 2002, they are also enrolled in ELED 3040 (Balanced Literacy) or READ 4019 (Reading for Secondary) or CURR 3002 (Inclusive Instruction for Secondary). These courses and instructors work collaboratively with our PDS to design field experiences in which students provide interventions to students and have opportunities to plan and implement tiered lessons for both special learners and LEP students. Throughout the program, ULM students have opportunities to team teach and to teach individually, preparing them for future interactions with special education inclusion teachers. During student teaching, students have the opportunity to participate with classroom teachers in all collaborative/consultative activities with parents, including IEP meetings. An addition to the curriculum designed to better equip our students to deal with challenging student behavior is SPED 3010, Behavior Intervention.

Initial certification Special Education programs at ULM are no longer offered at the undergraduate level. This certification is only available at the graduate level. Special education courses included in the program focus on culturally relevant pedagogical practices that increase success for students with limited English proficiency and those with special learning needs. Students apply these strategies in supervised lesson delivery. Faculty provide guidance and support through lesson observation and feedback as well as simulation experiences and case studies. Students learn to respond to special learner characteristics by planning adaptive/ accommodative strategies that will be applicable in tiered instructional design and they receive training in interpretation of evaluation results for instructional planning. The program provides guidance and supervision in the roles and responsibilities of the special educator in RTI, IEP, BIP, and transition processes, and provides background information and experiences to promote culturally sensitive collaboration between parents, students, school professionals, and pupil appraisal. Students have the opportunity as a part of the program to go into an elementary school on a regular basis to provide RTI in small group settings. Every Special Education course includes field experiences and opportunities to reflect on and share insights with other participants in the course.

The teacher education programs at ULM offer multiple unique opportunities for the students. All students are assigned a personal adviser upon entry to the program and receive readily available assistance in navigating their program. Undergraduates begin their school-based experiences during their first years in the program and participate in increasingly responsible supervised teaching assignments throughout their coursework. Principals have been quoted saying, "ULM students walk into the classroom on day one knowing how to teach." Academically, the program has been recognized by a national study as ranking among the top ten teacher education programs in the United States for best preparation in math instruction. Classes are small, promoting collaboration among students and providing accessibility to mentoring faculty. In addition to structured teaching experiences, ULM students have the opportunity to impact the community through service partnerships with Big Brother/Big Sister liaisons and a variety of service learning options.
