Liability of owners of unleased mineral interests for materials.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana that owners of unleased mineral interests and lessees in any drilling unit authorized by the Department of Conservation of this State, shall not be liable or obligated to pay to the operator or producer for materials furnished or used in the drilling, completion, and production of any oil, gas, or mineral well drilled on said unit a sum in excess of the prevailing market price of such materials.

Repealing clause.

Section 2. All laws or parts of laws in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Senate Bill No. 306.

AN ACT

To change the name of Northeast Center, a junior college of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College, an existing state\* institution located at Monroe in the Parish of Ouachita, Louisiana, to the name, Northeast Louisiana State College; to transfer administration and control of said institution from the Board of Supervisors of Louisiana State University, to the Louisiana State Board of Education; to direct the Louisiana State Board of Education to provide for said school, a school of higher education in the arts and sciences for the education of white children of the State of Louisiana; to provide for the transfer to the State of Louisiana of the site and facilities and all property of said institution; to provide for the building, equipping and continued maintenance of said institution; and repealing all laws in conflict herewith.

Northeast Center name changed to Northeast Louisiana State College.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana, that the name of Northeast Center, a junior college of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College, located at Monroe, in the Parish of

Ouachita, Louisiana, an existing state\* institution, be changed to the name, Northeast Louisiana State College, and the Louisiana State Board of Education is directed to provide for said school, a school of higher education in the Arts and Sciences, for the education of white persons of the State of Louisiana.

Section 2. That the Louisiana State Board of Education shall administer the affairs of said institution.

Louisiana State Board of Education to administer affairs.

Section 3. That the Board of Supervisors of Louisiana State University and Agricultural and Mechanical College shall transfer and convey the site and facilities now known as the Northeast Center, located at Monroe, Ouachita Parish, Louisiana, together with all buildings and improvements thereon, and all other lands and properties incidental thereto, to the State of Louisiana, and the Louisiana State Board of Education is authorized and directed to accept said property for the State and for the benefit of said Northeast Louisiana State College.

Transfer of site, facilities, etc. to Louisiana State Board of Education.

Section 4. That the State of Louisiana shall appropriate sufficient funds for building, equipping, continuing and maintaining the said institution.

State to furnish funds.

Section 5. That all laws and parts of laws in conflict with this act,\* be and the same are hereby repealed.

Repealing clause.

AN ACT

To amend and re-enact Section 10 of Title 17 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 so as to place Northeast Louisiana State College under the administration of Louisiana State Board of Education; and providing that this act\* shall have no effect until Senate Bill No. 306 is enacted into law.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana, That Section 10 of Title 17 of Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 be amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Educational institutions under administration of Louisiana State Board of Education.

Acquisition of  
lands and other  
buildings.

The Board of education shall purchase all lands, buildings, and equipment, and make all repairs, constructions, and improvements needed by the institutions listed in this Section, or any other institution placed under the control of the board in the future. For these purposes the board may incur debts and issue its notes, bonds, or certificates of indebtedness in evidence thereof, and pledge any funds made available to it by the legislature\* for that purpose.

AN ACT

To amend and re-enact Section 713 of Title 9 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 relative to mineral leases and contracts on minor's and interdict's property.

Section 1. Be it enacted by the Legislature of Louisiana, that Section 713 of Title 9 of the Louisiana Revised Statutes of 1950 be and the same is hereby amended and re-enacted so as to read as follows:

Section 713. Hearing; order

The judge shall proceed to hear the issues and render his order in the manner provided in R. S. 9:652 and 9:653. Mineral leases of minor or interdict's property.

Section 2. That all laws, or parts of laws, in conflict or inconsistent herewith be and the same are hereby repealed. Repealing clause.
