# 5. Guest Speaker(s)

a. Two members of Phi Mu Fraternity requested the full \$500 scholarship in support of their Miracle Man Scholarship.

- Miracle Man is a men's pageant put in place to raise money for Children's Miracle Network Hospitals. Men dress to their theme, display their talent, and do a tabling event. All proceeds go straight to the Children's Miracle Network.
- Children's Miracle Network Hospital is their philanthropy and they support children and their families through the hard times they may currently be facing. Phi Mu supports their local hospital in Little Rock, Arkansas where they tour.
- If scholarship is allocated, during the Miracle Man Scholarship Pageant SGA will be shouted out as a Sponsor and will be named on a poster board for display.
- -Senator Kelly Lohman thanked Phi Mu for coming to present and asked how much money has been raised in the previous years from the pageant. Phi Mu stated that \$10,000 was raised last year.

# 7. Department Head Updates

- a. Student Life and Welfare
  - i. Senator Moon informed the senate that Voter's Registration Week is next Week. She added that SGA will be partnering with other RSO's on campus to talk about voting on next Wednesday and Thursday handing out popsicles at the HUB and Cafe from 11:00 a.m.-1:00p.m.
  - ii. Moon let the senate know that her and President Maloney will be moderating for the Ties with ULM Guys next week and encouraged the senate to come by and support.
  - iii. Moon added that once departments are finalized then she will order the nachos from Iron Cactus for Homecoming Lunch Social.
- b. Promotions

- i. Senator Mayfield let the senate know that there will be a post going out tonight about election polling stations as well as election information. She asked the senate to make sure they reshare the post to their stories.
- ii. Mayfield told the senate if they have any questions or concerns then to reach out to her.

#### c. Research and Judicial Affairs

- i. Senator Thomas informed the senate that the Associate Senate will take place tomorrow and Thursday. She encouraged senators to sign up for the polling station at the cafe.
- ii. Thomas let the senate know that she is looking for senators to serve on the election commission Thursday between 5:00 -8:00 p.m. She let the senate know that if they already posted a candidates flyer then they cannot be on election commission because they must remain unbiased. Senators that will serve on the Election Commission for Associate Senate Elections are Senator Gabrielle Thomas, Senator Drake Prunty, Senator Keirsten Dixon, Senator Hailey Poydras, and Senator Kaylin Williams.
- iii. Thomas added that Homecoming Nominations are out and that the senate should encourage any RSOs they may be a part of to go ahead and nominate their candidates. Nominations will close September 20th and an email will be sent out when the closing date. She clarified that for Homecoming elections will be open to everyone so it will not go by classification this year and information about the candidate will not be underneath the name this year.

#### a. Treasurer

- iv. Spears concluded by reminding the senate to log their service hours and that the QR codes to access the form are on her office window as well in the GroupMe.

#### c. Vice President

- i. Vice President Habisreitinger let the senate know that polling stations start tomorrow and that she will be helping with the setup for the stations. She encouraged the senate to sign up for the service hour opportunity.
- ii. Habisreitinger informed the senate that she started Department Head Forms which includes an SGA Event CheckList, Financial After-Action Report, and a Monthly Assessment.
- iii. Vice President Habisreitinger added that there will be a few more updates to the SGA website which includes the SGA Event Calendar, The Election Link, and The Campaigning Violations Form.
- iv. Habisreitinger acknowledged that she wants to start an SGA Hawks Committee which will serve to assess any concerns/ project ideas from the student body through the suggestion link. She added this committee will meet once a week which will take the place of office hours and that if anyone is interested to sign up on the form that she sent in the GroupMe.
- v. Habisreitinger concluded by letting the senate know that she has been working on the senator's expectations for the Robert's Rules Workshop for retreat and to reach out to her with any questions or concerns.

- i. President Maloney informed the senate that September is Hunger Action Month. She added that today was Hunger Action day and she got to volunteer at the food bank today. She said that she is looking at September 27th to reserve a spot for the senate as a whole to volunteer @1:00 p.m. for an hour and that this event is mandatory.
